Dr. Aikaterini Papathanasiou is Professor and Interim Chair of the Comprehensive Care Department at Tufts University School of Dental Medicine (TUSDM). She is the immediate Past Graduate Program Director of the Advanced Education in Esthetic and Operative Dentistry program in the Department of Prosthodontics at TUSDM; she served in this position for 8 years. Dr. Papathanasiou graduated from University of Athens Dental School in Greece. She received her Postgraduate Certificate in Operative Dentistry, Endodontics and Cariology from Aarhus University Royal Dental College in Denmark and then continued her postgraduate training in Advanced Education in Esthetic Dentistry at Tufts University School of Dental Medicine (TUSDM), where she also received her DMD. Furthermore, she recently completed her Executive Master of Business Administration. Dr. Papathanasiou has been serving TUDM for more than 27 years, teaching pre-doctoral and post-doctoral students and conducting research. Since 2007 she has also served as a Visiting Lecturer for the Continuing Dental Education Programs at New York University College of Dentistry. She has conducted multiple research projects and has numerous publications in peer reviewed dental journals. She lectures and gives hands-on workshops nationally and internationally on topics related to esthetic and restorative dentistry. She is a Fellow of the International College of Dentists (ICD) and the International Academy for Dental and Facial Esthetics (IADFE). She served as the Editor in Chief of the Greek dental journal "Esthetic Dentistry and Implantology," and she is part of the Editorial Review Board of the Journal of Esthetic and Restorative Dentistry, the Editorial Team of REALITY ESTHETICS (REALITY Publishing Company) and the Editorial Review Board of Journal of Cosmetic Dentistry (jCD). Additionally, she serves on the Board of Directors of the American Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry as the University Member, and she is also the Chair of the University Relations Committee. Dr. Papathanasiou maintained, for years, a private practice limited to Esthetic and Restorative Dentistry in Athens, Greece and she currently practices part-time in Boston.

Being part of different committees and having served in different boards and rigorous leadership positions, I have learned the importance of teamwork, brainstorming by thinking "outside the box" and being broad-minded, open to new ideas and concepts while respecting the rules and guidelines of the organization. My leadership philosophy can be summarized as "Lead by Example". Concerning my organizational style, I am a very organized multitasker with good time management and ability to prioritize tasks and meet deadlines.

As a leader I focus on creating trust within the team, continuously motivate all team members, take initiatives, promote diversity, and work with the whole team to achieve more. Additionally, when working with others I promote clear communication, emphasize on respect and equality, listen more than I talk, and not afraid to assume account accountability

Throughout my academic career, I have been actively involved in clinical and didactic teaching, research projects, mentoring of students, residents and junior

faculty and conducting CE courses. Especially serving in leadership positions in the 2nd biggest US dental school for the last several years, has made me even more visionary and goal oriented. Leading with empathy and vision while being a good team player and a role model, has helped me succeed in all my goals. Through these administrative roles, I feel privileged to be able to recruit, inspire and help developing the new generation of academic leaders while promoting esthetic and restorative dentistry nationally and internationally. In my current position as the Interim Chair of the Comprehensive Care Department, one of my roles is overseeing all educational and clinical curricula and activities of over 100 faculty and staff members and over 400 third and fourth year DMD students.

My approach to fulfilling obligations can be summarized as establishing clear and open communication with all team members, managing my time efficiently as well as distributing responsibilities to team members by assigning them with specific tasks. I set up goals and work towards achieving them by always staying focused and assessing their progress continuously.

Having practiced in both Europe and US, in combination with being involved for more than 25 years in dental academia and having established a strong national and international professional network, I surely have a global perspective of how to better promote AACD and Esthetic Dentistry. This combined with my BOD and URC established experience, strong leadership skills and passion and dedication to the Academy, I strongly believe that I can further spread the AACD mission of clinical excellence in comprehensive cosmetic dentistry as well as high ethical standards in patient care.
