I have served on the BOD for the past 4 years.

Prior to that I served on the awards committee and the new member relations committee.

Presently I also serve on the Accreditation committee.

I'm also an AACD mentor and an accreditation examiner.

Describe any leadership experience you've had within your community or other dental organizations

I have experienced that leadership just for the sake of being a leader is useless. True leadership emerges from one's desire for a positive change. It emerges organically from one's passion projects.

My enthusiasm has always been rooted in promoting growth and education and building community. To give you a couple of examples - within my community, I started a Spear study club and grew it into a large , interdisciplinary study club. During the COVID shutdown, when we had no direction from the state or any dental organization, I created a group of over 80 local dentists. We stayed connected via WhatsApp and Back to Top helped each other navigate through all the various issues from PPEs to staffing to financial aid related questions. Years later, I still have local dentists approach me at meetings and study clubs to thank me for it. What I learned from that experience was that the impact I could create by doing something positive may not be huge but it may be extremely meaningful and relevant for a few people. And that is a win. I have also made it a point to go and speak to the UWSOD dental students at least once a year to tell them about educational and growth opportunities in the field of cosmetic dentistry.

Have you served on boards in the past? If so, what have you learned from this experience? Yes, I have served on the BOD for the past 4 years.

I experienced first hand that dentists that serve on these committees and the boards are truly passionate individuals who want to uphold the standards of AACD. I also learned that we have to be the change that we wish to see in the AACD.

Any organization is a nebulous concept. There is no AACD. WE ARE the AACD. WE have to recognize challenges. WE have to come up with ideas. And if we have the right ideas the boards are appointed with positive visionaries who will help you propel your ideas.

Why are you applying for this position?

While serving on the BOD, I realized that an organization is a nebulous concept. There is no AACD. WE ARE the AACD! I AM the AACD. We, in the leadership and also the general membership are the soul, the breath, the heart and the intellect of the AACD. Each individual member is a heart-beat. WE have to recognize challenges. WE have to come up with ideas and gather our tribe and implement solutions. WE have to be the change. Over two years ago, I proposed to the boards that we start an online study club to help solve not just the financial challenges but also to build community and camaraderie.

I created animation videos and created a mock model of a study club and presented it to the boards. While I believe anyone could have accomplished this, it did help to be in the leadership position to recognize the challenges and the opportunities. With an operating budget of mere \$5K, it was important to be a part of the leadership and be connected to the neural network of the leadership to come up with the idea, implement it and grow it.

My goal for myself as an ABCD member would be that I would continue to be a proven positive player in the leadership. Respectful of traditions and also looking for winning opportunities for the AACD.

The accreditation journey was such a personally and professionally metamorphotic phase in my life that I will forever be passionate about shedding more light on it and getting more attention to it. To that end, as an ABCD member, I would want to work with others in leadership to continue to highlight it; come up with ideas to promote it.

What is your vision for the future of the AACD?

My vision for AACD is that it should be regarded as the beacon that upholds the highest standards in cosmetic dentistry. I want members to be proud of the fact that they belong to the AACD family.

My vision is that the AACD continues to provide a place for clinicians and lab technicians to grow and enrich themselves and accomplish goals that they set for themselves.

To that end, the AACD should be a financially stable organization that invests in its members by providing unparalleled educational opportunities, mentorship and credentialing

My leadership style is one of building consensus and leading by example. I believe that honest discussions and progress can happen only when we all respect each other. Over the last four years on the BOD, I have cultivated friendships with the AACD core team and the board members alike.

As a board we have been able to accomplish some major goals as far as working towards our goal for financial stability.

As a board member and a leader, I feel honored that the core team finds me approachable and regards me as someone they can turn to, to provide a sounding board for ideas.

Over two years ago, I proposed to the boards that we start an online study club to help solve not just the financial challenges but also to build community and camaraderie.

I created animation videos and created a mock model of a study club and presented it to the boards. The boards approved and I was handed the charter. And so the Esthetic Skills Studio - AACD's Global online study club was born. With an operating budget of mere \$5K, it was undoubtedly a challenge. I reached out to many educators to volunteer their time. We had many challenges but we just successfully finished our first year with 70 members in the club. We have over 55 members already registered for next year and we have a stellar line-up of educators.

ESS has been a passion project. I have given it my heart and soul for the last 2 years. I have had endless phone calls with educators as we booked them for the lectures. Numerous hours of working with the AACD team member Ms Katie Neubauer and working with the Accredited coaches. The project has been challenging at times but I would not trade this feeling of doing something positive for anything else.

The AACD offers our members a superb opportunity to form friendships which could be brought into conflict when policy decisions or approaches must be addressed. Tell us about how you might balance those friendships when policy or ethical issues create such a conflict.

Raised in a military family, I have a very strong sense of right vs wrong. I don't think I will have a problem knowing right from wrong. If a situation arises where I must recuse myself, I will do so without any hesitation. Friendships are important but nothing is more important than personal integrity. I would never put at risk what I have worked so hard to achieve in my life. I would also never compromise the standard of ethics of the academy.

What do you bring to this position that is unique or distinctive? How will you make a difference?

I can't say this is unique to me since I have met some exceptional people at the AACD. But I'm a creative and a critical thinker. I believe that dentistry is a journey of personal growth. I bring that perspective to decision making.

My biggest interest is in building community and promoting education through the AACD. I believe this is the key to attracting best fit members that stay loyal to the AACD. I think ESS is a step in the right direction as it builds community and it promotes exceptional education while generating revenue for the AACD. Over the course of last one year, I have seen several of these members get interested in the accreditation journey as well.

I want to continue to help with ESS of course but also look for more untapped opportunities to build more camaraderie within AACD members.

Ultimately, the purpose of serving the AACD is to support our membership. Tell us how you see yourself relating to the membership and forming a bridge between the Board and our members. I think social media is a big platform to reach the next generation of dentists. I have been mentoring a lot of younger dentists through this platform already.

I have also stepped up to be an AACD mentor and have been mentoring a few dentists towards their accreditation goals.

Another connection that is vital for our Academy's growth, I believe, is with the General members that are not pursuing accreditation. I have volunteered as a 'Guide' and have been helping younger clinicians with their esthetic cases as well.

What unique ideas do you have to build and grow our membership?

It is important not only to acquire new members but in-fact also to retain our General members. The biggest attrition is due to General members leaving. Through my numerous interactions with General members two key themes have emerged

Members would like to be 'recognized' not just after they achieve accreditation but also

for their commitment to continued growth and education. - I have proposed that we honor our members when they take 'n' number of CE courses through the AACD

Inertia affects everyone and is often a barrier to pursuing new goals. General members

wanting to pursue accreditation often tell me that they wish there was more help with the written exam. - I have proposed that we have a written exam review workshop on the first day of our AACD scientific session. This will not only make our general members feel valued but will also increase the number of candidates starting their accreditation. People who are invested in their growth through the AACD are less likely to want to leave the organization. To that end, I took the initiative and am leading the ESS study club with it's 70 members world-wide.

Younger generation of dentists is very active on social media. I will be working on ideas to bring the ESS AACD study clubs on Instagram and create a social community.

One other idea I have is to create an AACD podcast. I believe we have a lot of very qualified members in our AACD community we could highlight them and their work via the podcast.

Being a visiting faculty at Spear Education, I have had leadership workshops/courses through Spear Education. I have also taken Dr Homoly's communication workshop. Other than that, I enjoy reading a lot of books on leadership and getting people to work together.

Residents are dedicated learners who prioritize skill development over immediate financial gains, making them prime candidates for membership. Engaging with residency programs would help build a strong pipeline of future AACD members who are committed to advancing their expertise. These initiatives would not only foster growth but also deepen member engagement across all stages of their careers.
